Students and staff had a unique opportunity to engage with industry leaders to understand their initiatives. The students learned about ESG approaches they can adopt and incorporate into their assignments and projects.

In the lead-up to the event, students enrolled in the Team Building and Community Service modules offered by the Centre for General Studies (CGS) carried out several projects focussed on SDG15 Life on Land, SDG 11 Sustainable Cities and Community, and SDG3 Good Health and Well-being. The excursion to the National Science Centre by 25 orphans from the Sweet Care Home highlighted the importance of quality education, while the food distribution programme under the Hope Worldwide Malaysia addressed immediate needs and promoted community well-being. These initiatives raised students' awareness of the SDGs, fostered community engagement, and encouraged lifelong learning.

Building on these past initiatives, the faculties will spearhead discussions with faculty members to incorporate ESG compliance into curriculum enhancement and delivery. ESG-related activities will be integrated into faculty initiatives to ensure our programmes remain relevant and aligned with the SDG framework to empower our graduates to make







impactful and meaningful contributions in the sustainable business landscape. Additionally, the SSD will organise more ESG activities and events to provide our students with opportunities to showcase successful ESG innovative projects. FACULTY OF DESIGN AND BUILT ENVIRONMENT STUDENTS VISIT PERCETAKAN IMPRINT FOR INDUSTRIAL INSIGHTS



On 6 August 2024, the Faculty of Design and Built Environment organised an educational trip to Percetakan IMPRINT which was attended by 26 students and two lecturers. The participants comprised students from various year groups and semesters, including students from the Diploma in Graphic Design, BA (Honours) in Graphic Design, and BA (Hons) in Fashion Marketing programmes.

The visit was designed to enhance students' understanding of modern printing technologies and techniques, aligning with both their academic coursework and industry requirements. Key areas of focus during the tour included the 4-Color Printing Process, where students learned about the CMYK colour model and its application in producing high-quality prints, and Spot Colour Printing with an emphasis on Pantone's colour matching system.

Participants also explored the latest advancements in Digital Printing Technology and observed the practical applications of Die-Cut Printing and Hot Stamping, gaining insights into how these methods are used to enhance the aesthetic appeal of printed materials.

Additionally, the students were introduced to various Binding Techniques, such as Stitched, Perfect, and Stapler Binding, learning how each method impacts the durability and visual appeal of printed products. The tour also covered the importance of selecting appropriate Types of Paper and the impact of different Finishing Techniques, including Lamination, Varnishing, Embossing, and UV Coating, on the final product's quality and functionality.



The visit to Percetakan IMPRINT was not only informative but also inspiring, providing students with a comprehensive overview of the printing industry. It reinforced the importance of technical skills and industry knowledge for their future careers, effectively bridging the gap between classroom learning and real-world applications.



SIEMENS EDA CUSTOM LAYOUT FLOW AND CALIBRE DESIGN SOLUTIONS TRAINING




Organised by Universlink Integrated Solutions Sdn. Bhd. and Emerald System Sdn. Bhd., the training on Custom Layout using the Pyxis Layout tool took place from 13 August to 15 August 2024.


The online session featured Ahmed Nour from Universlink Integrated Solutions as the presenter. Four staff members from the Faculty of Computer Science and Technology participated: Dr. Norhayati binti Mohd Zainee, Asst. Prof. Ir. Dr. Marcus, Dr. Mas Izzati Binti Fazin, and Dr. Nur Dalila binti Rizuan.

The training focused on the custom layout flow using the Pyxis Layout and Calibre analysis, specifically utilising version 24.2 of the Siemens EDA virtual machine. Key topics included an introduction to the custom layout flow and practical examples such as the

single-stage operational amplifier layout. The training also covered MOS transistor matching techniques, guard ring implementation, power routing, and hierarchical layout flow.

Overall, the training significantly enhanced the lecturers' understanding of layout flow features available in Siemens EDA tools and provided detailed knowledge in analog design using Mentor Graphics.

PEER COUNSELLOR PROGRAMME - SESSION 4
"HOW CHANGING YOUR THOUGHTS CAN
TRANSFORM YOUR LIFE"

On 7th August 2024, the Student Services Department conducted the fourth session of the Peer Counsellor Program, titled "How Changing Your Thoughts Can Transform Your Life." Facilitated by licensed counsellor Teh Chia Li, the workshop attracted eight students from various faculties.



The session began with participants introducing themselves, followed by a discussion on why people react differently in similar situations. Ms. Chia Li provided insights into Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) and introduced 10 common unhelpful thinking patterns. Students engaged in a mini-activity to recognize their own thought patterns, followed by completing a Dysfunctional Thought Record worksheet to document their thoughts and emotions.



A key highlight of the session was a role-play in which a student volunteered to act as a client while Ms. Chia Li demonstrated counselling techniques using the Dysfunctional Thought Record. This practical exercise provided participants with the opportunity to observe and learn essential skills for peer counselling.

Reflecting on the session, Goh En Qi, a Bachelor of Computer Science (Intelligent Systems) student, noted, "I learned about the 10 most common unhelpful thinking patterns. I also learned that by shifting our automatic thoughts, we can instantly change the way we view a situation or person. It was indeed a very fruitful workshop."



This session underscored the importance of self-awareness and cognitive strategies in personal growth.
